


Sandy River in Phillips, Maine

The Sandy River is a free flowing river in Western Maine that enters into the Kennebec River in Norridgewock. Water levels vary greatly throughout the season, this picture shows the river after a major rain event. There is also a healthy population of wild brown trout for fly fishing enthusiasts. The Phillips pluton, shown exposed in this photo, is a granitic pluton showing cylindrical potholes created by abrasion.
